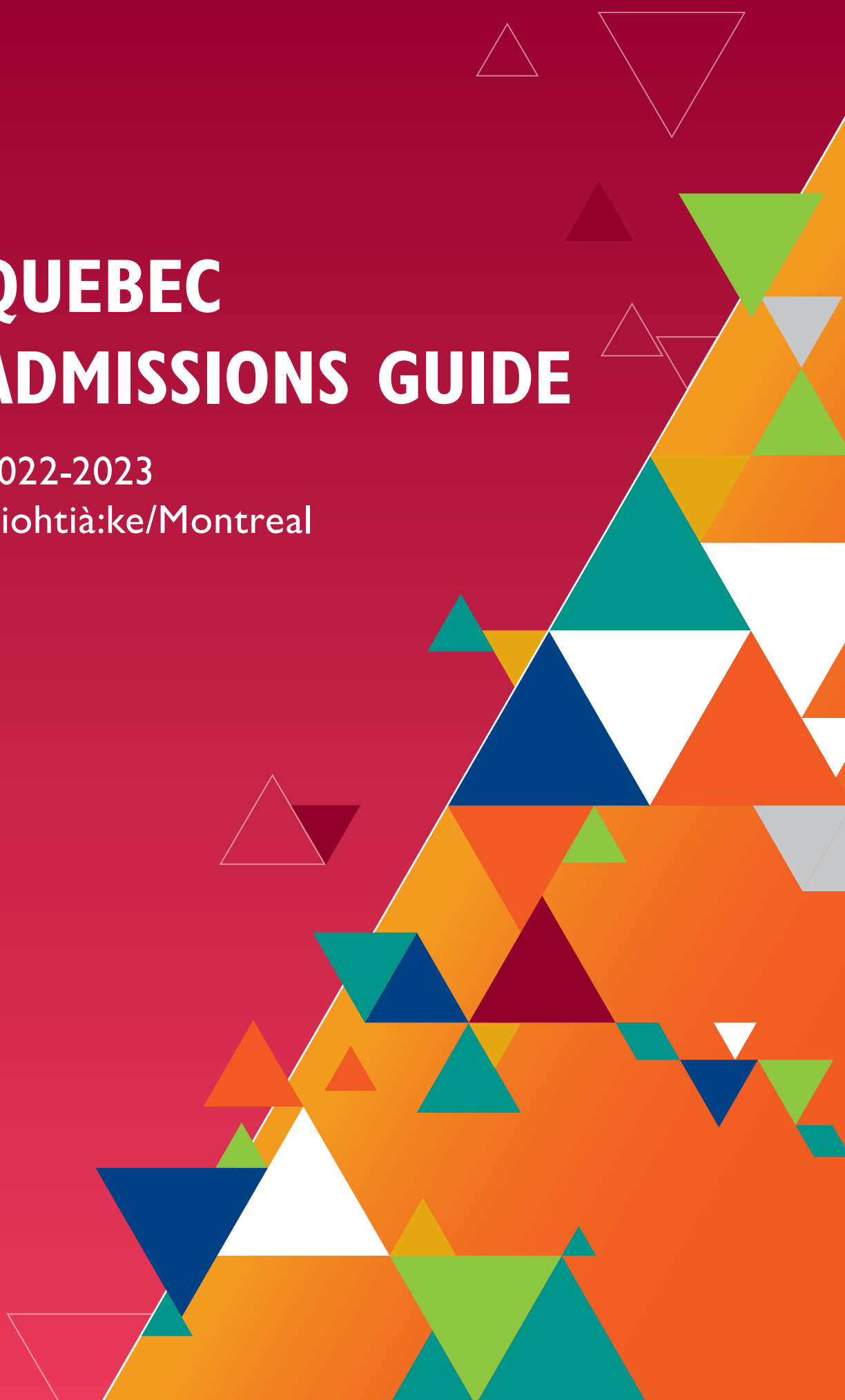

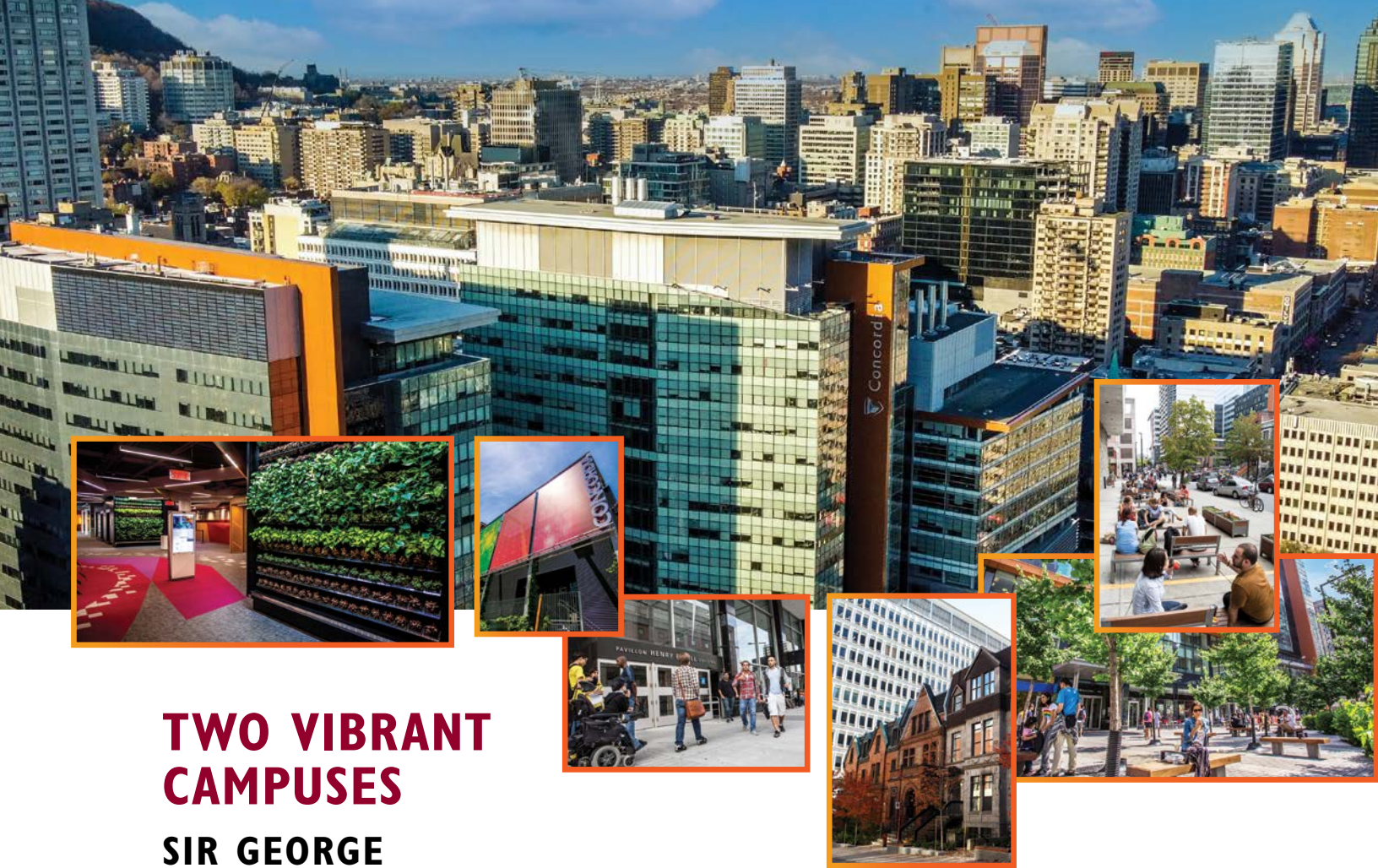

### SIR GEORGE WILLIAMS CAMPUS

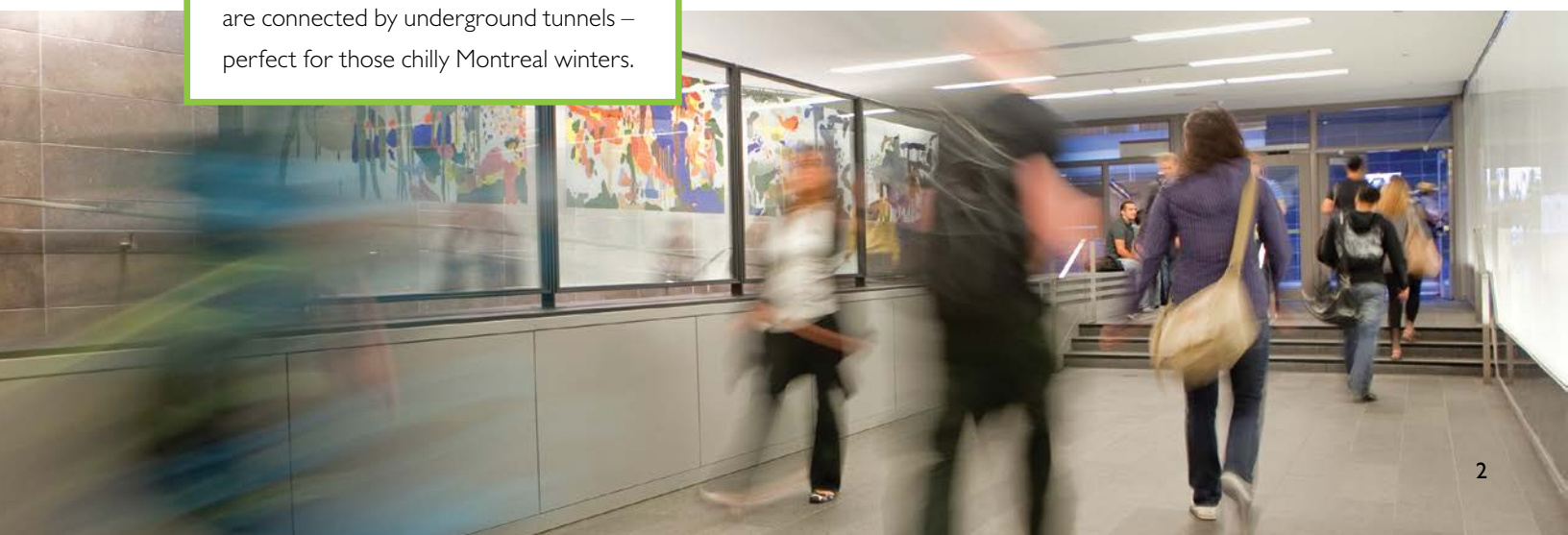
The **Sir George Williams (SGW) Campus** is located in the bustling core of downtown Montreal. The campus is made up of nearly 40 buildings, from century-old row houses to steel and glass high-rises. With a metro station (Guy-Concordia) and a bike path at the centre of our campus, Quartier Concordia is in the middle of the action with endless cafes, restaurants and shops to explore between classes.

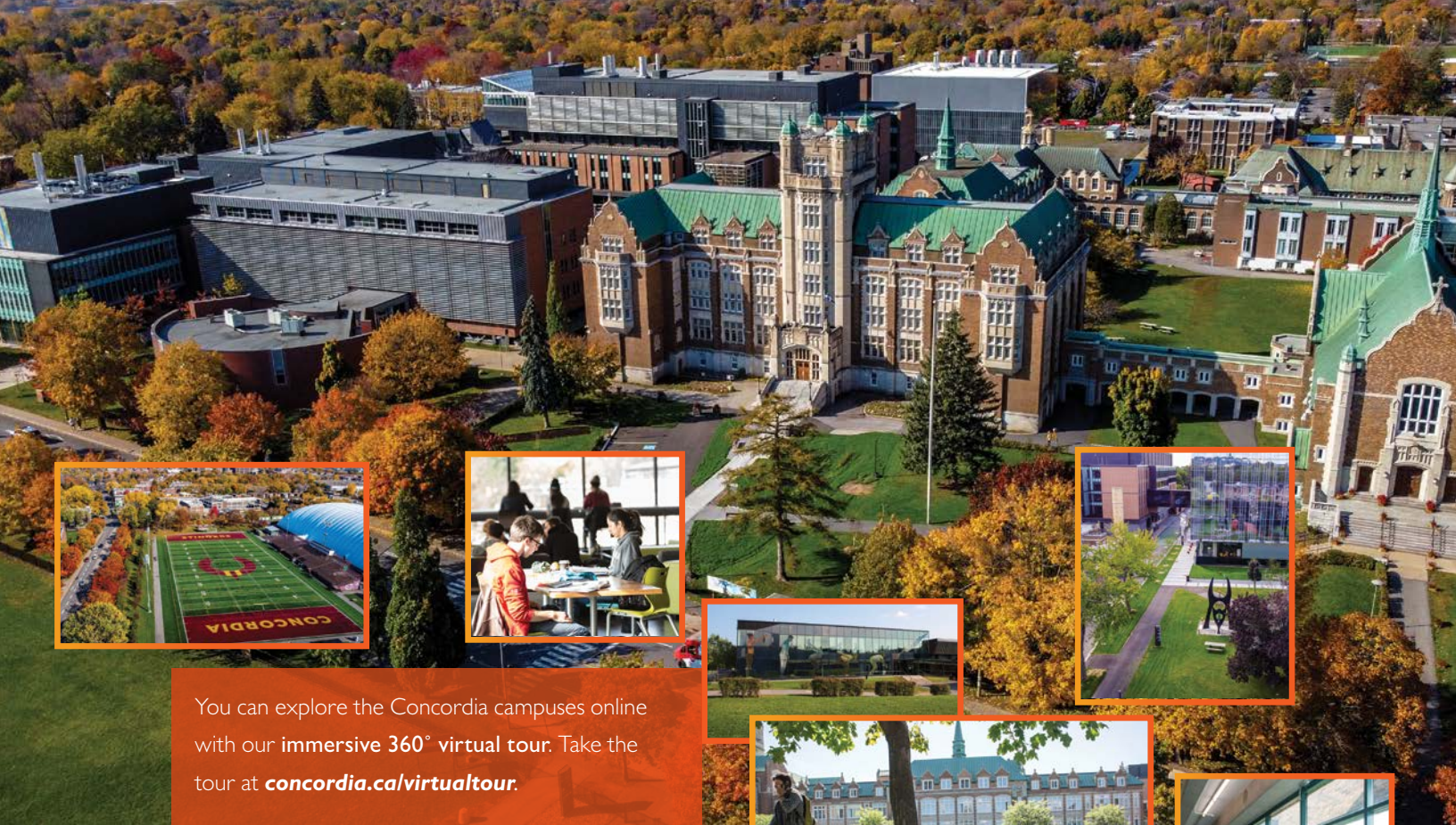
**Fun fact!** Many of our downtown buildings are connected by underground tunnels – perfect for those chilly Montreal winters.

## LOYOLA CAMPUS

The **Loyola Campus** is our beautiful leafy oasis in the city. Take a moment to breathe and relax in the Quad. Located 6.5 km west of downtown, Loyola blends cutting-edge facilities with turn-of-the-century buildings in the beautiful west-end neighbourhood of Notre-Dame-de-Grâce.

- Journalism

At Loyola you'll also find our **Recreation and Athletics Complex**, home to our varsity sports teams (Go Stingers!), the new \$62 million state-of-the art **Applied Science Hub** and the **Oscar Peterson Concert Hall**.

Students can commute between the two campuses via a 30-minute ride on our **free shuttle bus**. Or take your bike (or a Bixi) on the dedicated cycle path!

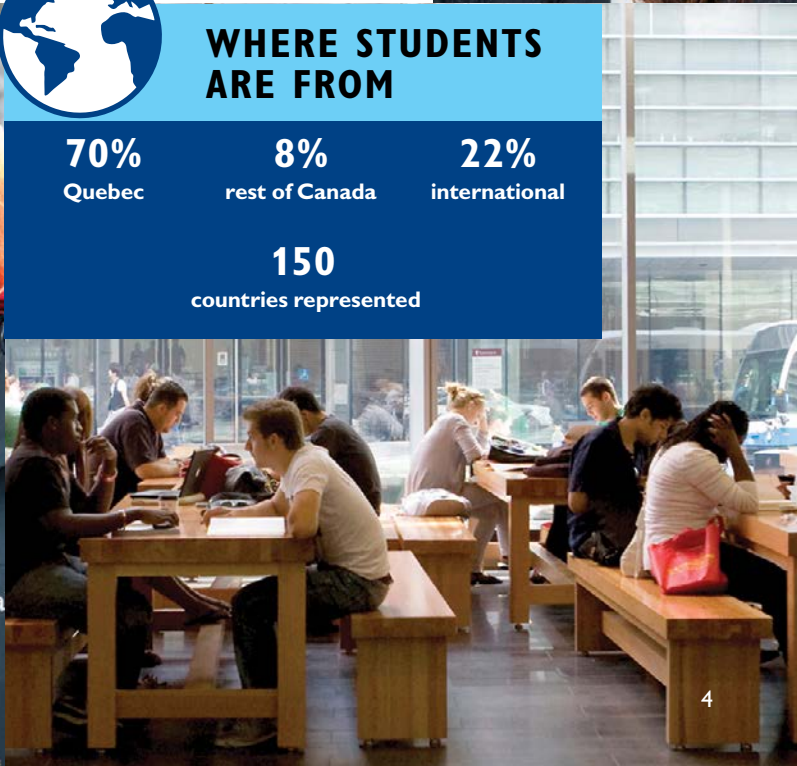

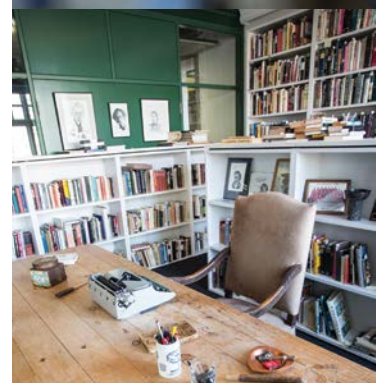

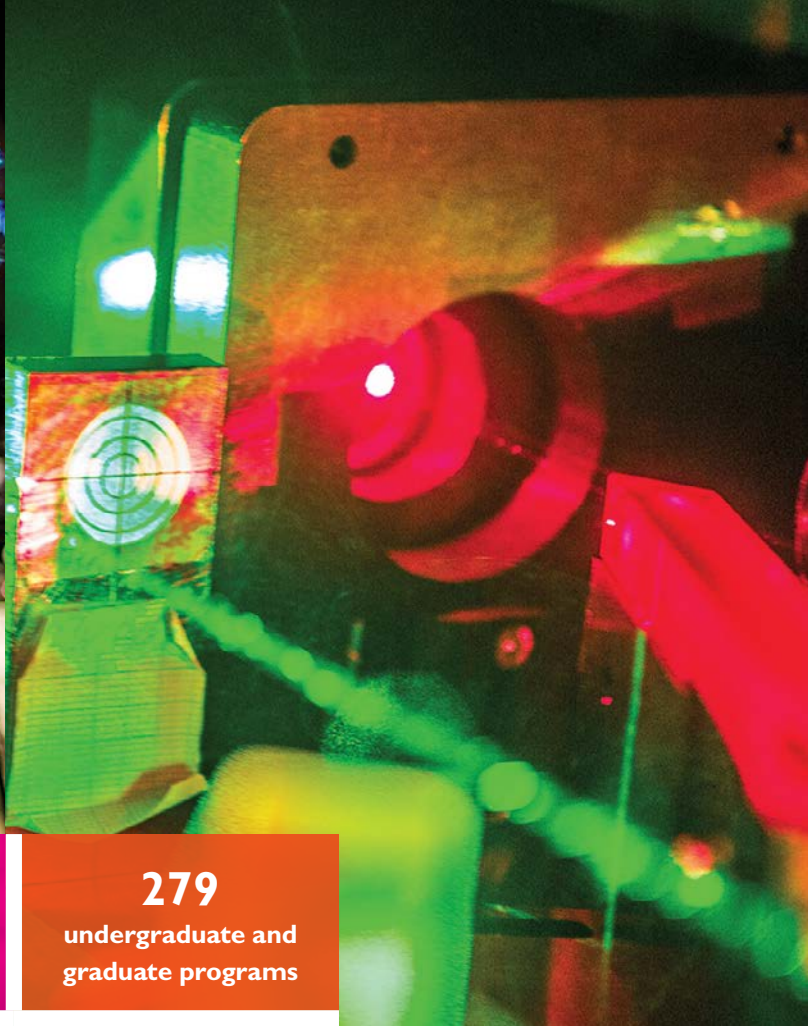
Undergraduate degrees in the Faculty of Arts and Science consist of the following components:

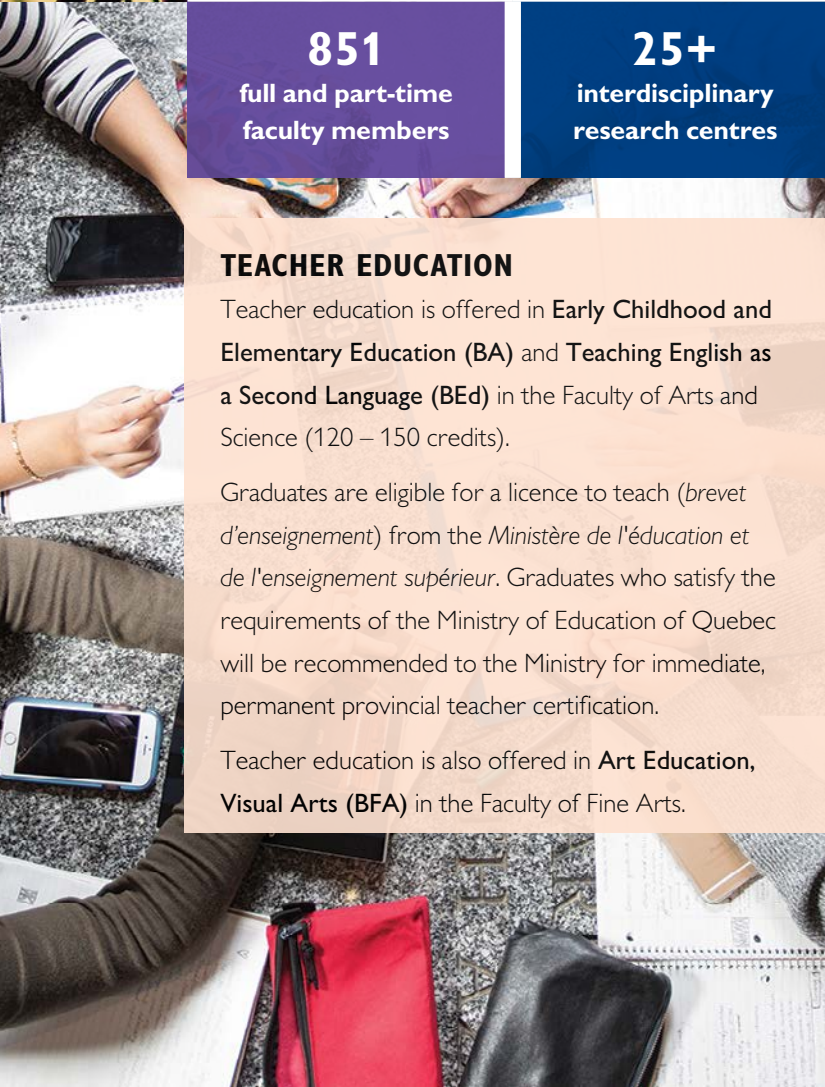

### TEACHER EDUCATION

Teacher education is offered in **Early Childhood and Elementary Education (BA)** and **Teaching English as a Second Language (BEd)** in the Faculty of Arts and Science (120 – 150 credits).

Graduates are eligible for a licence to teach (*brevet d'enseignement*) from the *Ministère de l'éducation et de l'enseignement supérieur*. Graduates who satisfy the requirements of the Ministry of Education of Quebec will be recommended to the Ministry for immediate, permanent provincial teacher certification.

Teacher education is also offered in **Art Education, Visual Arts (BFA)** in the Faculty of Fine Arts.





# FACULTY OF FINE ARTS

Unique in Canada, the **Faculty of Fine Arts** houses nine departments that offer an unparalleled range of programs in the visual, performing, cinematic, design, digital and therapeutic arts. Integrating new technologies, traditional media and historical fine arts practices, the Faculty of Fine Arts is home to artists, scholars and researchers active on the international and national stages and engaged in their local communities.

As a Fine Arts student, you'll have access to the space and equipment you need to realize your artistic vision, from sun-drenched ateliers to sound-proof recording studios.

Admission to most BFA programs is based on your grades and a strong portfolio or audition. Applicants must apply for admission online before submitting a portfolio or doing an audition.

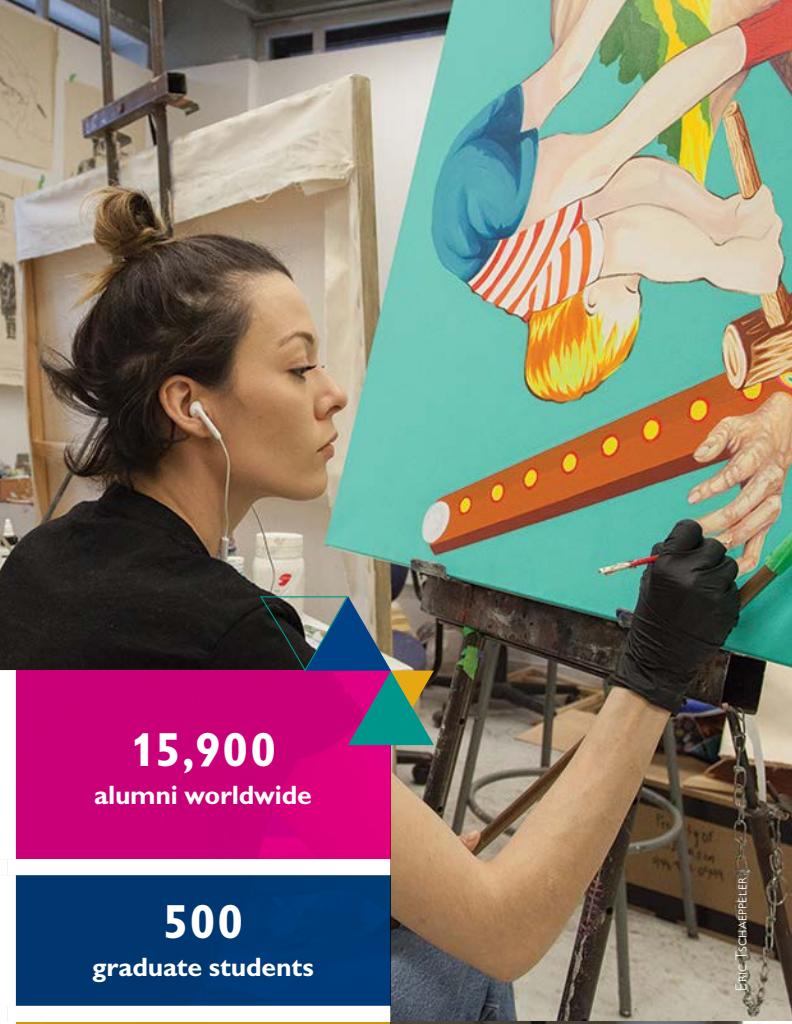

At the **Gina Cody School of Engineering and Computer Science**, we train the next generation of engineers and computer scientists to discover, create and build the technology that shapes our daily lives.

As an engineer you will be a builder of modern society; engineering education teaches you to design products, systems and processes that provide creative solutions to the world's toughest problems. We offer programs in **Aerospace, Building, Civil, Computer, Electrical, Industrial, Mechanical and Software Engineering**.

Computer science uses theoretical and mathematical foundations of computation to understand both software and hardware structure for effective and creative design. In addition to our **Computer Science** and **Health and Life Sciences** programs, we also offer cross-disciplinary joint programs in **Mathematics and Statistics** and **Computation Arts**.

All of Concordia's engineering and computer science programs are accredited by the Canadian Engineering Accreditation Board and the Canadian Information Processing Society, respectively.

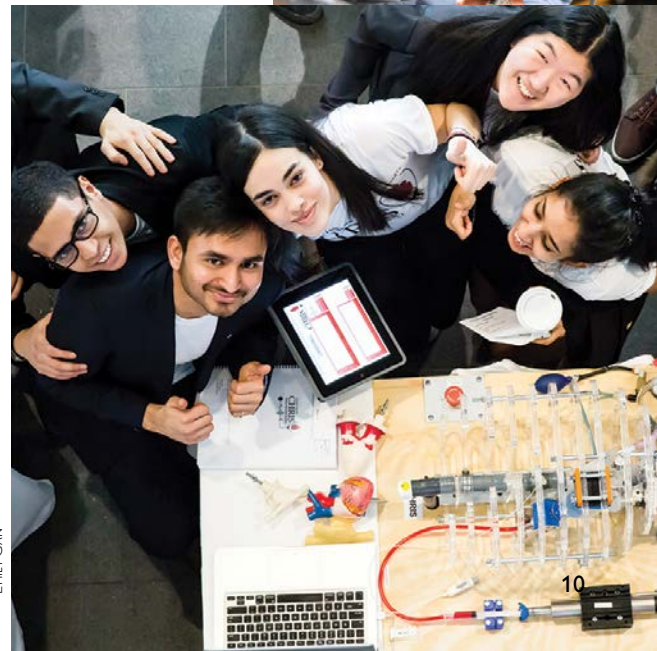

## PROGRAM STRUCTURE

### BACHELOR OF COMMERCE (BComm)

Students in the BComm program must select a major. BComm programs consist of:

- Business core courses
- Courses from the student's chosen major
- Elective courses (12 credits must be from offerings outside the School of Business)

Students may also complete an optional 12-credit business minor in addition to a major.

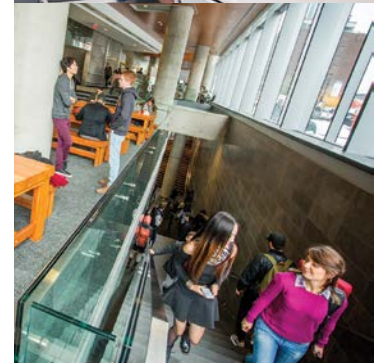
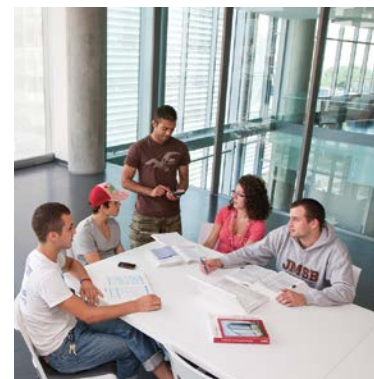
### BACHELOR OF ADMINISTRATION (BAdmin)

BAdmin students take the same set of core courses as BComm students, but do not take a major.

The BAdmin program consists of:

- Business core courses
- Elective courses from School of Business disciplines (may include a minor in a business discipline)
- Elective courses from outside the School of Business (may be used to add a minor in a non-business discipline)

\*Places in residence are limited, therefore students living more than 50km from Montreal are prioritized in the application process. If you are currently living in Quebec, we recommend looking into off-campus housing options to ensure you have housing.

## GOVERNMENT STUDENT FINANCIAL AID

Concordia participates in all Canadian government student financial aid programs. **Make sure you apply for government student aid as soon as possible**, as it can be a lengthy process! We recommend applying for student loans at least six to eight weeks before the start of classes. You do not need to be admitted to start this process.

## EXTERNAL FINANCIAL AID

External awards require a separate application. You can find a list of privately-funded scholarships and bursaries sponsored by external associations, companies, foundations, societies and clubs at [concordia.ca/external-awards](http://concordia.ca/external-awards).

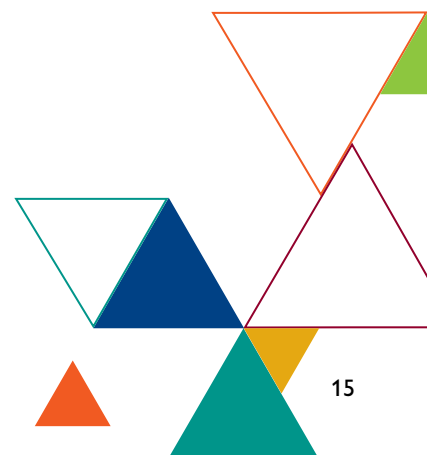
## ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Your application to Concordia is also your application for an entrance scholarship! There's no need to apply separately. Concordia's **entrance scholarships** are awarded based on academic achievement, along with other criteria in some cases.

Incoming students who are in financial need may be eligible for special funding in the form of a **bursary**. You can apply using the Entrance Bursary form on the Student Hub.

## JOBS ON CAMPUS

You can earn some money, build your CV and connect with the university community by working on campus. Eligibility for the **Work-Study Program** is based on financial need. Find out more at [concordia.ca/work-study](http://concordia.ca/work-study).





# BEFORE YOU APPLY

## TERMINOLOGY

- A **major** requires you to take enough courses for a general overview of a field, while leaving extensive room for exploration outside the field.
- A **specialization** provides a more in-depth study of your field while leaving you room to take other courses.
- **Honours** is a highly concentrated program, ideal for students planning to continue to graduate studies. If you are interested in Honours, speak with your program advisor once you've been admitted.
- A **minor** gives you a basic introduction to a field. You can add a minor to complement a major, specialization or Honours, but you can't complete a minor by itself. Minors are optional.
- **Elective courses**, depending on your program, allow you to explore interests outside of your required courses.
- **Co-op** provides the opportunity to participate in paid work experience during your degree. For more information, visit [concordia.ca/co-op](http://concordia.ca/co-op).

## APPLICATION DEADLINES

We give priority to applicants who apply by official deadlines, but do consider late applications if places are still available, for the fall term only. Not all programs are available for January entry. Visit [concordia.ca/application-deadlines](http://concordia.ca/application-deadlines).

# STEPS TO APPLY

1. Have your **three program choices** ready.
2. Have your **permanent code** available (students who have studied in Quebec only).
3. Check your **programs' admission requirements**. Look for things like specific math and/or science requirements, a letter of intent, a portfolio, etc. You may need to submit these additional documents directly to the academic department. Check [concordia.ca/programs](https://concordia.ca/programs).
4. **Apply online** at [concordia.ca/apply](https://concordia.ca/apply).
5. Include your **required supporting documents** (see page 18 for details):
  - You may upload supporting material to your application even after submitting it. We recommend doing so as quickly as possible as we cannot assess your application until we receive all required documents.
  - Students with offers of admission will need to send official documents once they complete their schooling and before enrolling at Concordia.

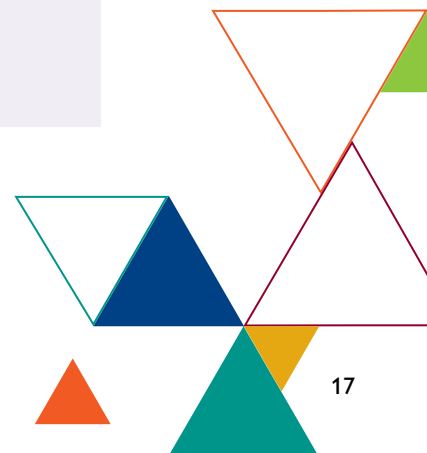

## YOUR THREE PROGRAM CHOICES

- **Your choices should be in your order of preference.** If you don't get accepted to your first choice, we'll automatically consider your other choices, in the order that you specify. If admitted to a program, your remaining choices will be cancelled.
- **Pick a new subject for each choice.** For example, don't choose the specialization and major in the same subject (e.g. Psychology) for your three choices. If you don't meet the requirements for the specialization, we'll automatically consider you for the major instead.
- **Consider programs with varying admissions requirements.** Avoid selecting programs that have exactly the same admission requirements.
- **Consider including a less competitive program among your choices.** This will help maximize your chances!





# REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

## QUEBEC CEGEP STUDENTS

Your **permanent code** is required on your application. This will allow us to receive your transcripts automatically. For program-specific requirements including minimum grades, see pages 20-26.

## QUEBEC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Students in **Quebec high schools** (studying Ontario, IB or any other curricula) should consult our website for admissions requirements: [concordia.calugradrequirements](http://concordia.calugradrequirements).

## HOME-SCHOOLED APPLICANTS

We treat each home-school case on its own merits. In some cases, an interview with a university official may be required.

To apply, submit all supporting application documents, e.g. SAT and AP test scores and transcripts from any academic institution attended. You must also include:

- A **description of the home-schooling curriculum** followed and measures of academic acquisition in the program
- A **letter of intent** explaining the basis on which admission is sought and a letter from the home educator detailing how the home-school program has prepared the applicant for university studies
- A **letter of recommendation** from an impartial source indicating the applicant's readiness for university-level study

### ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

If the primary language of your education for the last three years is not English, then you may be required to submit **proof of language proficiency**. Students who have completed high school or CEGEP in Quebec, however, are **exempt** from this requirement. Visit [concordia.calugrad-elp](http://concordia.calugrad-elp) for more details.

# TRANSFER APPLICANTS FROM COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES

If you're interested in transferring to Concordia from another institution we will consider your transfer application on the basis of both your university or college studies and your prior studies. We will consider placing you at an appropriate level within your chosen program; the number of transfer credits awarded depends on the nature, quality and quantity of the work completed. A minimum of 45 credits, and in some cases 60 credits, must be taken at Concordia to complete your degree. The minimum grade required for consideration for admission is a C average.

- Upload **transcripts from any university or college** you've attended, indicating any courses in progress.
- If you attended CEGEP, include your **permanent code** on your application. If you did not attend CEGEP, upload your **high school transcripts**.

## TRANSFER CREDIT EVALUATION

Academic credit may be awarded for university-level courses that are equivalent to Concordia courses and appropriate to the program to which you are applying. An evaluation of transfer credits will be made once you have received an Offer of Admission, paid the confirmation fee and have provided all the necessary documents.

# MATURE ENTRY PROGRAM APPLICANTS

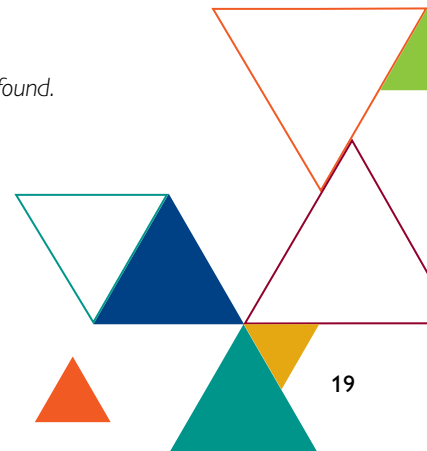
If you do not meet Concordia's minimum academic admission requirements (for example, you did not complete high school, did not attend CEGEP or started but did not complete a DEC), you may be eligible to study at Concordia through the **Mature Entry Program**, based on your age, experience and academic potential. To find out if you are eligible, please visit [concordia.ca/mature](http://concordia.ca/mature).

To apply as a mature student, upload the following documents in addition to your admissions application:

- **Curriculum vitae (CV)** or resumé
- A **letter of intent** explaining:
  - Why you have chosen to study at university at this time. Outline the reasons for your choice of program, and your goals and aspirations.
  - Describe any experience, knowledge or skills you have acquired that would assist you in your studies.
- A **birth certificate** or other accepted proof of age
- **Transcripts**

# MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR CEGEP STUDENTS

A two-year pre-university program or a three-year professional DEC is required for admission from CEGEP.

The CRC requirement for admission varies depending on the program, as detailed below. Please refer to the minimum cut-off averages as indicators; because of the number of applications received, applicants who meet the stated minimum requirements are not guaranteed admission to these programs.

Applicants missing some of the prerequisite courses may still be eligible for admission. However, we recommend applicants complete as many of the prerequisite courses as possible within their CEGEP program.

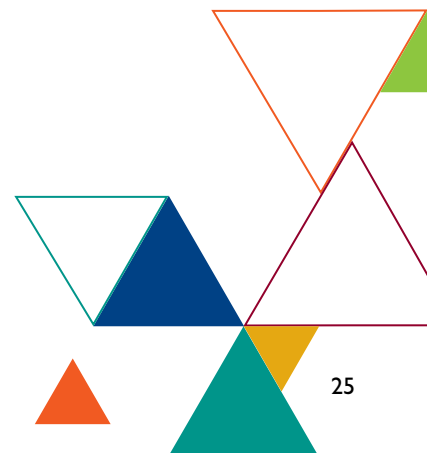

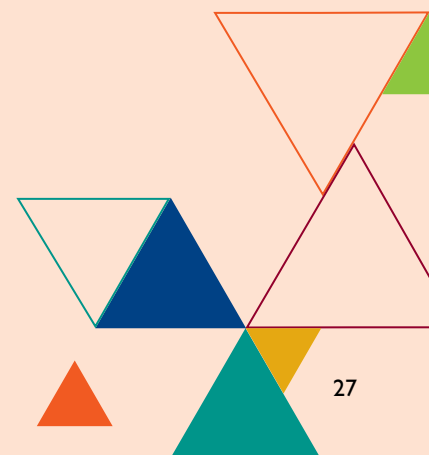
